

A message from Dr. Camille Taylor, Superintendent

ATTENDANCE HEROES

Why Is Consistent Attendance at School Important?

Missing school negatively impacts student learning. Falling behind happens quickly, and it can be difficult to catch up. Low attendance often leads to below-grade-level reading skills—an indicator that a student is at a higher risk of not graduating from high school. Studies show that it takes 1-1/2 days to catch up for one missed school day. When a student is absent "only a couple of days each month" over the school year, that adds up to missing 10% of their instruction for their grade level. Missing 10% (18 days) of school is considered chronic absenteeism. Chronically absent students are supported through the SST and SARB process.

In addition to the negative impact of absences on individual students, there is also a negative financial impact on the school/district. For each percentage of absence lost over the course of the school vear, our district loses approximately, \$72,500. Last year, the school's attendance rate was 90%, which means that this year, our budget has to operate with approximately \$725,000 (10%) less than what we could have potentially received in federal, state, and local revenues.




That's a LOT of resources lost! We are sharing this information with staff and families so that we can work together to improve our individual and overall attendance rate this year for student success and maximize resources for everyone! Of course, it goes without saying that if your child is sick (fever, vomiting, etc.) please keep them home!

Who are the Foresthill Attendance HEROs?

H.E.R.O. is an acronym for Here Everyday and Ready to Learn On Time! Students who maintain an attendance rate above 96% are Foresthill Attendance HEROs. At Foresthill Divide School, we want the best for our students, and just by showing up, we can help them achieve their potential! Attendance is critical for each student's success, and together we can be HEROs.

EXPANDED LEARNING OPPURTUNITY AT FORESTHILL


Our Expanded Learning
Opportunities Program (ELO-P)
is growing quickly and taking
off. Through this program, we
have exciting news!

Beginning August 17, 2023, the Kids Club before and after school care is now free to students who have current ELOP Registration and a current Attendance Calendar on file.

Due to increased demand, please note the following:

- Current ELOP Registration must be on file before your student can participate in any ELOP programs.
- Without a current monthly Attendance Calendar on file, your child is not guaranteed a space in Kids Club.
- If there is space available, but you haven't given at least 24 hour notice, you will be charged a \$20 drop-in fee.
- If space is not available or your child is not registered, you will be called to pick up your child from the school office.
- These conditions apply to all FDS students, regardless of FRPM or child-of-staff status.

Non-School Day Kids Club participation remains free for students of families who have completed the applications and qualify for FRPM, foster youth, and homeless students. For families who do not qualify for FRPM, the sliding-scale will apply (see <u>ELOP Handbook and Registration Form</u> for details). Printed ELOP Registration Forms and Handbooks will also be available at the Kids Club Kiosk.



ENRICHMENT CLASSES

Last year, we introduced after-school Enrichment Classes to the ELOP program, which took off and inspired teachers and students to try new things. **Enrichment Classes are back** again this fall! To register for Cycle 1 Enrichment, complete an ELOP Registration Form and sign your child up for an Enrichment Class.
